Message from the President Mark Jackson

"You want me to do what?!"

I find myself saying this more and more (usually to myself) at work these days. Not in a disgruntled, grouchy old guy way, but more in amazement at the variety and complexity of what we are now asked to do in Public Works. I've been in transportation and public works for thirty years now (yes, I am that old). I think back to what that world looked like then. Very traditional: build the roads, plow the snow, fill the potholes, and keep the lights on and water running.

Don't get me wrong; we still do these things and do them very well. Public Works will always help keep communities safe, operational, and moving. Public Works answers the bell whenever needed. But the depth, breadth, and complexity of what we are now asked to address are anything but traditional. In my community over the past several years, our team has been asked to clean up illegal homeless encampments and construct an alternative shelter compound for the unhoused in our community. Our Public Works team became experts in disinfecting public buildings and office spaces to keep our employees safe during the height of the pandemic. Our field crews are now trained in de-escalation techniques to defuse an increasingly angry and impatient public.


I raise all this not to lament the "good old days", but instead to suggest that as our Public Works world evolves in many new areas, we will need to develop new skills and

broaden our scope of expertise to meet these challenges. This is a critical time for our profession as many in our workforce are preparing to retire, and both public and private agencies are finding it difficult to recruit, hire and retain new employees to take their place. Partnerships with our schools and community colleges, as well as creative apprenticeship programs will be critical in exposing students and recent graduates to the variety of opportunities Public Works may afford them. We will need to "grow our own" to find the next generation of skilled, talented workers.

I urge us all to get creative and start thinking about how we bring the next generation into Public Works and help them gain the skills and experience needed for success in a rapidly changing world. We also need to provide our existing workforce with training opportunities to keep their skills current and sharp. This is where APWA really shines!

With that I wish you all a happy and warm spring. I hope to see you at any of our planned events around the state. Be safe and do great work!


National Public Works Week (NPWW), held May 21-27, 2023, is almost here!

Compost Changes

Juliana Archuleta Adams County Stormwater Administrator Sustainability Committee Chair

For communities with compost collection programs that deliver materials to A-1 Organics, new rules are effective April 1, 2023.

New and more simple guidelines were adopted. Accepted materials for residential and commercial compost collection are limited to:

- ONLY food scraps
- ONLY yard / plant trimmings
- ONLY 3-gallon certified (CMA Approved) compostables bags used to collect food scraps



WHY? 10% of material received by A1 Organics is too contaminated to process effectively and meet the quality standards for finished compost. A1 Organics is reducing the accepted material list as the first step in eliminating contamination.
